TFT 2000: DEVELOPING INTERNET PROJECTS INTEGRATING THE NEW YORK STATE LEARNING STANDARDS AND CURRICULUM

DESCRIPTION:

Computers with Internet Access support learning environments where critical academic skills can be learned, and where students can prepare for the world of work ahead. The research and communication capacity of the Internet in particular can provide powerful opportunities for the kinds of activities specified in New York State learning standards and curriculum frameworks. In these sessions, technology pioneers will be supported in developing, evaluating and modeling best practices of technology integration.

This 5-session course is offered in two sections. Tuesday sections use Pentium II P.C.s; Wednesday sections use Power Macs. The five sessions are as follows:

Session 1: Internet Software: E-Mail, Netscape Communicator, FTP, Forum

Session 2: Internet Activities: Internet Searching, Managing Bookmarks, Website Evaluation, Webpage Creation.

Session 3: Integrating Internet Resources into Your Curriculum

Session 4: Meeting New York State Standards, Model Lesson Plans

Session 5: Developing Internet-Based Lesson/Project Plans
